NEW ENGLAND TELEPHONE COMPANY PETITION HEARING

Mr. Bill Wilson of New England Telephone Company appeared to respond to questions about a petition for installation of conduit on Church Street for the purpose of serving and 8 unit subdivision. As usual, Selectman King did not participate in the hearing. Hearing no objections, the Board voted 2-0 to grant the petition.

CHANGE IN VOTING PLACE FOR PRECINCT 11

At the recommendation of the Town Clerk, the Board voted unanimously to change the place of voting for Precinct 11 to the Keefe School because of the congested parking problems in Downtown Framingham.

COMMENDATION

The Board presented a Commendation to Lieutenant Charles Muto recognizing his 38 years of service to the town as a police officer. They congratulated him on his exemplary conduct and wished him well on his retirement which became effective on April 1, 1988.

DISCUSSION RE: HERBERT STREET EXTENSION/ARLINGTON STREET/CAMPBELL ROAD

The Board had a discussion with the owners of a parcel of property at the end of the new Herbert Street industrial extension. Mr. & Mrs. Gossels stated their willingness to provide the town with a highway right of way across their property for the purpose of extending the industrial access road, but said they must have an assurance that Arlington Street would not be closed to truck traffic and regular traffic since this is their only other outlet and access to the building. After a brief discussion, it was expected that Town Counsel would be consulted concerning setting up a proper agreement to protect the interest of the town and the Gossels.

CONFERENCE - NEIGHBORS FOR SOUTHSIDE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION RE: CONRAIL/FLEXI-FLO

Mr. David Bufo, as a spokesman for the southside group, presented a list of concerns about the proposed expansion of the rail transport operation of General Motors which currently is in operation off Hollis Street. They pointed out many of the concerns about environmental disruption and the impact on the neighborhood. They were assured by the Board of Selectmen that the interest of the neighbors would be protected and that no specific agreement or action would be taken without holding a public hearing.

CONFERENCE RE: ZAYRE CORPORATE HEADQUARTERS TRAFFIC SIGNALIZATION

The Board met with Attorney John Garrahan who requested approval to include and install a traffic control signal at the entrance to the new Zayre Corporate Headquarters which is almost completed. Attorney Garrahan pointed out that the installation of this traffic control signal was part of the agreement made by the Zayre Corporation upon the submission of their original plans and had been approved by the Planning Board. In view of the fact that the occupancy permit for the building would be solved within

the next few months, Attorney Garrahan requested authorization to have the traffic signal installed as it was layed out. The Board voted unanimously to authorize the installation of the light. It had been hoped that it could be moved a bit farther south on the street to accommodate a more ideal traffic pattern but it was known that land would have to be acquired from Conrail in order to effect the relocation, it was decided to move ahead with the original plan.


