BOSTON EDISON COMPANY HEARING

Mr. Steve Kane appeared on behalf of Boston Edison Company to request approval of a use of conduit for service to Mayflower Circle just off Church Street. As usual, Mr. King did not participate in these hearings. Hearing no objections, the Board voted 2-0 to approve the petition.

CONFERENCE - NOBSCOT AREA CITIZENS

Town Meeting member, Nancy Swidler appeared with several of her neighbors to present a petition objecting to the proposed development of apartment condominiums at the Nobscot area. The citizens raised several questions in connection with the proposed development which will be the subject of a Zoning Board of Appeals hearing. In addition to the questions of congestion, safety, environmental impact, etc., Selectman King asked that the affect on the sewer and water systems in the area be checked. The selectmen assured the residents that they would do everything possible to be certain that regular impacts to the area would be checked and all of the information obtained would be forwarded to the Zoning Board of Appeals.

REQUEST FOR CIRCUS BY REGIONAL FAMILY Y.M.C.A.

The Board reviewed a request to approve the use of Bowditch Field for a circus on June 3, 1988 as a fundraiser for the regional family Y.M.C.A. The matter was tabled until such time as the Park Commissioners and the Police and Fire Department could be contacted concerning authorizations and safety concerns.

SAFETY OFFICER RECOMMENDATIONS

The Board reviewed a recommendation to install a NO PARKING ANYTIME sign at 15 Jackson Place. It was approved by a 3-0 vote based on the Safety Officer's recommendation.
