BOSTON EDISON COMPANY HEARING

Mr. Joe Bausk of New England Telephone Company represented both Boston Edison Company and New England Telephone Company on a petition to install a pole for a special light at the crossover on Route 30 adjacent to the New England Telephone Company engineering building. As usual, Selectman King did not participate in the hearing. Hearing no opposition, the Board approved the petition by a 2-0 vote.

HEARING RE: ISSUANCE OF STOCK

Attorney Richard DeAngelis appeared to represent the owners of Cugino's, Inc., 732 Waverly Street, to request approval of the issuance of stock in the corporation in connection with a Wine & Malt Beverage Package Goods Store license. Permission to issue 960 shares of stock was sought to make approximately forty-nine percent of them available to Marie Mazzarelli from the current owner, Mr. Edward Montalbano. Under the regulations of Chapter 138, Section 15A of the Massachusetts General Laws, the Board voted unanimously to approve the issuance of stock as requested.

CONFERENCE RE: HOLMES TRANSPORTATION (LEGGATT McCALL PROPERTIES)

Attorney Paul Galvani was accompanied by Mr. Eric Sheffels and Mr. Brad Griffith who represent Leggatt McCall properties to request that the Board of Selectmen call a Special Town Meeting for the purpose of acceptance of the public way to be built in connection with the development of the former Holmes Transportation property. The development is for an office building to be leased in its entirety to McCormack & Dodge for a corporate center. Approval of the procedure from the Planning Board was received in an accompanying letter. It was proposed that an article be submitted to town meeting for the acceptance under specific conditions of the described access road which would connect Burr Street with Speen Street. After a brief discussion, the Board voted unanimously to call a special Town Meeting for Wednesday, June 15 for the purpose of reviewing and submitting such an article to town meeting. The warrant was opened officially and it was indicated that the warrant would be closed on Friday, May 13 at 5:00 P.M.

REQUEST FOR CARNIVAL LICENSE

The Board reviewed a request from Rev. Alfred Almonte to hold a Carnival and Italian Festival on the church grounds at 562 Waverly Street for St. Tarcisius Church. The schedule would be for June 23, 24, 25 & 26. Noting that there had been difficulty in control of parking on Casey Court and general traffic control, the Board approved the application subject to the recommendations of the Police Department and the Safety Officer concerning the control of parking and the requirement for special police officer attendance.

SWORN WEIGHER REQUEST

The Board received a request from Triram Corporation to appoint Michael Mulvey of 7 Scarsdale Road, Worcester, Massachusetts as a Sworn Weigher for the duration of his employment at Triram Corporation of 721 Waverly Street. The Board voted unanimously to make such an appointment.

SPECIAL ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE LICENSE REQUEST

The Board reviewed a letter from Timothy Hanna requesting permission to serve liquor and food and provide live entertainment on the outdoor area of the premises under a license of Really Michael's at 1672 Worcester Road, on May 22, 1988. The area would be designated and special police officers would be hired for control of the operation. The purpose of the event would be to raise funds for the wife and children of Paul Carr who was killed in a tragic auto accident in the Town of Natick.

After hearing the presentation, the Board voted approval of the special permission on that day for the fundraising event.
