CHANGE OF MANAGER - LIQUOR LICENSE:

The Board of Selectmen voted unanimously to grant Change of Manager to Columbus Club, Inc. of Framingham, 11 Fountain Street, Framingham, subject to the approval of the Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission, from Michael F. Tosches, Jr., Present Manager to Richard H. Fagnoli, New Manager, All Alcoholic Club.

HEARING - NEW ENGLAND TELEPHONE & TELEGRAPH CO. PETITIONS - EDGELL ROAD AND BAYBERRY LANE FOR INSTALLATION OF CONDUITS

Mr. Joe Bausk, representing New England Telephone Co. appeared on behalf of the petitions for installation of conduit for completion of services. The Board heard no objections and after hearing the petitions, they took the matters under advisement.

CONFERENCE RE: GENERAL CHEMICAL COMPANY

The Board met with Town Counsel Aaron Bikofsky who updated them on the current situation with the licensing of General Chemical Co. He stated that the attorney representing General Chemical had indicated that they would contact the Zoning Board of Appeals for a review as directed by the Building Commissioner. At the request of Mr. Bikofsky, the Board voted unanimously to authorize him to seek the assistance of an environmental expert to determine the environmental impact of the operation of General Chemical.

CONFERENCE RE: NEXT DOOR, INC. - 666 WAVERLY STREET

Attorney Joseph Annunziata appeared on behalf of the owners of this establishment requesting that the current suspension be terminated and considered complete to allow the owners to go forward with a possible sale of the business. The Board took the matter under advisement.

SAFETY OFFICER RECOMMENDATIONS

1. The Board voted unanimously to accept the recommendation of the Safety Officer that the Engineering Department investigate the possibility of installing a Stop sign and street light at the intersection of Nicholas Road and Pinewood Drive.
2. The Board voted unanimously to authorize the installation of a Resident Parking sign in front of 14-16 Cedar Street and in front of 17 Cedar Street as requested. The cost of the installation would be borne by the resident who requested it.

ITALIAN AMERICAN WAR VETERANS CLUB - 35 SOUTH STREET

On recommendation of Police Chief Brent Larrabee, the Board voted 2-0 to reinstate the All Alcoholic Beverage Pouring license at this location with the following stipulations:

1. Hours of Operation will be from Noon until 7:00 P.M.
2. A key card control system will be activated and kept in operation at all times before the license can be put into effect.
3. No functions can be held at the location without clearance by the Framingham Police Department before the function is scheduled.

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STRATEGIC PLANNING GRANT FOR GOLDEN TRIANGLE

Upon recommendation of the Human Relations Commission, the Board voted unanimously to appoint Ms Dianne Finney of the Framingham Resource Center at 650 Waverly Street as a member of the Fair Housing Committee.

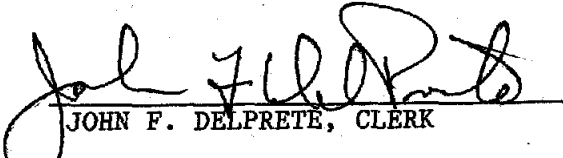
ELECTRICAL PERMIT FEE WAIVER
