The Board approved and signed a two year Labor Contract with the Firefighters for the period of July 1, 1987 to June 30, 1989.

TWO DOG HEARINGS WERE HELD:

1. MC NALLY DOG:

This hearing opened at 7:35 P.M. The Dog Officer testified that some citizens in the area have heard barking dogs while others in the same area did not hear barking dogs. Mrs. Francis Furey testified that she heard barking dogs and produced a petition. Arlene Mederos testified that dogs begin barking at 10:45 P.M.

Mr. McNally produced a letter which said dogs were not barking in the area. The Dog Officer felt that barking dogs could be some other dogs and not Mr. McNally's junk yard dogs.

Mr. McNally said he would try to find a home for the dog named Nutmeg and replace it with another dog. He also agreed to house Nutmeg in a kennel for a week to see if the complaints would end. The hearing closed at 8:05 P.M.

2. MAGRI DOG:

This hearing opened at 8:05 P.M. The Dog Officer testified that the dogs have been problems since 1985. The dogs killed a Canadian Goose and Woodchuck. The dogs have been observed by residents circling a cow in an attempt to bring it down.

The Dog Officer feels the dogs are in a wild state and are terrorizing areas. Jennie McGowan testified that she is fearful of herself and her own dog, since they attacked her.

Selectman John DelPrete requested that Mr. Gadbois find out why Mr. Magri did not show up for the hearing.

The Dog Officer recommended that the dogs be destroyed. The Board voted to have the dogs destroyed.

APPOINTMENTS:


The Board appointed Mr. Ronald Studley as the Assistant Treasurer/Collector for a term of three years, to expire January 31, 1992.
