CONFERENCE - BERNARD GARRON RE: PARKING SITUATION AT 5 HOLLIS COURT:

The topic of discussion was the use of the Hollis Street Parking Lot. Mr. Garron owns an apartment house on Hollis Street and he has no area for parking since there is limited parking on Hollis Street.

The Board took under advisement his request for four parking spaces in the Hollis Street lot.

CONFERENCE - SENATOR BURKE RE: BOB JACHOWICZ AWARD:

Bob Jachowicz, a long time football coach and teacher in the Framingham School system was praised for contribution to the community. Recently, he was inducted into the High School Football Hall of Fame.

ADJOURNED CATV HEARING:

Attorney Roger Dowd and Joseph Neal appeared before the Board and requested that the hearing be recessed until May 15, 1989 at 8:00 P.M.

Mr. Gadbois gave a report to the board which was a result of his conversation with the Town's consultant, Charles Beard. The report highlighted the following:

1. The engineering work done by the present owners of the CATV is satisfactory and appears as though a thorough job was performed in rebuilding the system.
2. In researching the reputation of the buyers, it was found that they had a very good reputation in the CATV business. They were in the top 1/3 of the CATV businesses in the country.
3. A major reservation the consultant, Charles Beard has regarding the sale, is the fact that at this time, the equity financing of 11 million dollars is not in place. Only three million dollars could be determined.
4. The consultant feels as though there may need to be a rate increase and it should be documented as to the need for it.

Selectman John DelPrete emphasized his concern for effective and responsive local management.

Selectman Philip Ernst noted that Town Counsel informed him that there were no local ordinances impeding the sale of the CATV license.

Chairman of the Board, John King, emphasized the need for stable rates, and that the old contract had been carried out to the letter of the law.

OLD BUSINESS:


The Board addressed the issue of Health Insurance Rates and approved the recommendation of the Personnel Department.
