HEARING - BOSTON EDISON COMPANY PETITION - GATES STREET - CONDUIT:

The hearing for installation of conduit on Gates Street was postponed until September 11 because a Boston Edison Company representative was not available for comment.

JOINT ELECTION - FRAMINGHAM HOUSING AUTHORITY:

A joint meeting of the Framingham Housing Authority and the Board of Selectmen was held at 7:30 P.M. The purpose of the meeting was to make an appointment to the Framingham Housing Authority due to the resignation of William D. Oleson.

Three individuals indicated an interest in the position by writing letters of interest. The individuals were Robert Federico, Phyllis May and Mary DiManno.

On a motion by Robert Jachowicz, Robert Federico was nominated. On a motion by Earl Haley, Phyllis May was nominated. There being no further nominations, nominations were closed. On a roll call vote, Robert Federico received four votes and Phyllis May received two votes. Following the roll call vote, a motion was made by Selectman John DelPrete to make the appointment unanimous, and the motion carried unanimously.

CONFERENCE - SAMIR MAJMUDAR (owner) - TRANSFER OF OWNERSHIP OF A LIQUOR LICENSE - FINAL FRAME RESTAURANT REALTY TRUST TO RAVI ENTERPRISES, 110 MT. WAYTE AVENUE - WINES & MALT BEVERAGES RESTAURANT (continuance)

Mr. Majmudar appeared before the board and outlined his previous experience in managing eating and liquor establishments. He stated he had attended Cornell University and had managed establishments in Boston and the surrounding area for at least five years. The Board made it very clear that it considered serving to minors a serious matter and emphasized their concerns. Following the discussion with Mr. Majmudar, the Board voted to transfer the liquor license held by Final Frame Restaurant Realty Trust to Ravi Enterprises, subject to the approval of the Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission.

CONFERENCE - FINANCE COMMITTEE RE: SPECIAL TOWN MEETING AND FY '90 BUDGET DEFICIT:

The Chairman of the Finance Committee, Mike Rossi and Finance Committee member James Dwyer appeared before the Board of Selectmen and outlined the four options the Finance Committee felt the Town Meeting could consider for addressing the deficit the Town was facing due to the loss of State Aid. Selectman John DelPrete stated that he could not support options three and four. The reason being, that it would indicate that the Selectmen were bargaining in bad faith in terms of working conditions for town employees. He stated that option two, which would reduce the FY '90 budget seemed to be the more responsible option of the four. Selectman Philip Ernst concurred with the comments of Selectman John DelPrete.

RECOMMENDATIONS OF SAFETY OFFICER RE: SLOW BLIND DRIVEWAY SIGN ON AUGUST DRIVE:

Upon the recommendations of the Safety Officer, the Board approved the installation for a Slow Blind Driveway sign on August Drive, thirty feet east of Central Street.

REQUEST FROM THE PLYMOUTH CHURCH TO PARK ON THE PERIMETER OF THE CENTRE COMMON:

The Board granted permission to the Plymouth Church to park on the perimeter of the Centre Common on Saturday, September 30, 1989 from 10:00 A.M. to 3:00 P.M. in connection with the annual Plymouth Church Country Fair.

RECOMMENDATIONS OF SAFETY OFFICER RE: STOP SIGNS (2) ON LESLIE ROAD:

The Board approved the installation of Stop signs on Leslie Road at Oaks Road for east and westbound traffic and on Leslie Road at Stoneybrook Road for westbound traffic, subject to a study by the Town Engineer.

REQUEST FROM DENIS SINTIRIS TO OPERATE A LIMOUSINE SERVICE:

The Board voted to deny the request of Mr. Denis Sintiris to operate a limousine service because the operation was not allowable in a residential district.

CORRESPONDENCE RE: EXECUTIVE ADMINISTRATOR GOALS AND OBJECTIVES:

The Board voted to accept and approve a statement of the Goals and Objectives for the Executive Administrator. This statement is the result of the Incentive Grant the Town received from the Executive Office of Communities and Development.

CORRESPONDENCE FROM SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS RE: COLLECTIVE BARGAINING - LEGAL EXPENSES:

The Board approved the request of the Superintendent of Schools to expend more than \$25,000 on collective bargaining for FY '90. Selectman John DelPrete commented that he thought there might be some savings if all of the collective bargaining was done by the Town Counsel.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

STORE 24 - HOURS OF OPERATION:

The Board voted that there would be no change in hours of operations. Store 24 would be allowed to continue its operation as it has been doing for the past ten years.

Selectman Ernst explained that there had been no complaints received by the Board and since the Chief of Police was not opposed to the store being opened on a 24 hour basis, he felt that there was no justification to restrict the store's hours of operation.

JOSEPH BESARDI GRIEVANCE:

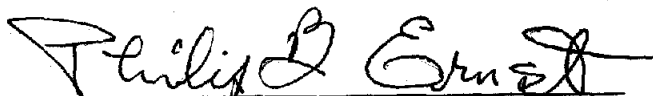
The Board of Selectmen addressed the Joseph Besardi Grievance. On a motion by Selectman John DelPrete, the Board voted to deny the grievance.
